Judging Criteria for the Runnymede Sports Awards 2009

PLEASE NOTE: To be nominated for an award individuals must be a resident of Runnymede or attend a club, school or sports organisations based in the district, whilst sports clubs and school must be based in the district.

SPORTS TEAM OF THE YEAR

This award is for a club team that meets one or more of the following:

- Achieved success or competed at a consistently high level throughout the year;
- Demonstrated fair play and a good sporting attitude throughout the year: and/or
- Overcome adversity

DISABILITY SPORTS AWARD

This award is for a Surrey Coach of performer who that meets one or more of the following:

- Had a significant impact on disability sport;
- Devoted continuous time and resources to the development of disability sport;
- Overcome barriers and exclusion to excel in sport;
- Acts as a role model for other disabled people

OUTSTANDING SERVICE TO SPORT

This award is for an individual who meets one or more of the following:

- Contributed significantly to sport over a long period of time;
- Demonstrated continued enthusiasm and devoted time and resources to enable others to take part;
- Raised participation and enjoyment of sport in their community.

YOUNG SPORTS TEAM OF THE YEAR

This award is for the school of junior club team that meets one or more of the following:

- Demonstrated fair play and a good sporting attitude throughout the year;
- Achieved success or competed at a consistently high level throughout the year;
- Overcome adversity.

VOLUNTEER AND YOUNG VOLUNTEER OF THE YEAR

This award is for a coach, official, administrator or general who meets one or more of the following:

Criteria:

- Demonstrated enthusiasm and commitment to a sport or club;
- Made a strong impact on a club or organisation through volunteering;
- Been involved for a long time in a sport or club; and/or
- Shown a commitment to personal development, team working and supporting the development of other volunteers.

Young Volunteer Criteria (aged 18 or under as of 31st December 2009):

- Demonstrated a maturity beyond their years; acting as a role model for other volunteers;
- Signed up to a volunteer scheme such as Step into Sport or Duke of Edinburgh.

SPORTS PERSONALITY OF THE YEAR

This award is for an individual that meets one or more of the following:

- Made significant progress in the field of the sport
- Had a significant impact on sport in Surrey; and/or
- Exceeded expectations in their sporting performance or made a big difference to a team

YOUNG SPORTS PERSONALITY OF THE YEAR

This award is for an individual aged 18 years or under (as of 31st December 2009) individual that meets one or more of the following:

- Made significant progress in the field of sport;
- Had a significant impact on sport in Runnymede;
- Exceeded expectations in their sporting performance or made a big difference to a team.

SPORTS CLUB OF THE YEAR

This award is for a club that has achieved some or all of the following:

- Gained or Attained an NGB accreditations;
- Demonstrated successful partnerships with local schools and community organisations;
- Evidenced commitment to volunteer recruitment, recognition and training;
- Increased membership and participation levels;
- Operation both a senior and junior section;
- Provided sporting opportunities for males and females; and/or
- Offered provision for disability sport.

COACH OF THE YEAR AND YOUNG COACH

This award is for an individual who achieved some or all of the following:

- Made an impact in their sport by increasing participation;
- Made an impact in their sport by improving individuals' or a team's skill level or performance;
- A minimum of an NGB Level 1 coaching qualification;
- Evidence of their own coaching development;
- Committed to providing the highest standard of coaching to their performers;
- Evidence of mentoring or helping other coaches;
- A positive, encouraging attitude that has inspired, guided and influenced progression in their sport.

Young Coach Criteria (aged 18 or under as of 31st December 2009):

- As above for those within the age restrictions
