

what do the flood warning codes mean?

You should watch the weather, tune into the local TV and radio for updates and ring Floodline for the latest information when any flood warnings are issued.



Flooding of low-lying land and roads is expected. Be aware, be prepared, watch out.

What this means for you

- drive carefully as roads may be flooded
- tell your family, friends and neighbours what's happening
- move pets, cars and valuables to a safe place.



Flooding of homes and businesses is expected. Act now!

What this means for you

- follow advice for a Flood Watch
- use sandbags or flood boards to block doors and airbricks
- be prepared to turn off your gas and electricity supplies.



Severe flooding is expected. There is extreme danger to life and property. Act now!

What this means for you

- follow advice for a Flood Watch and a Flood Warning
- co-operate with emergency services and local authorities as you may be evacuated to a rest centre
- avoid contact with floodwater, it may be contaminated.



Flood Watches or Warnings are no longer in force for this area.

What this means for you

- remain alert in case the situation deteriorates and any new flood warnings are issued.

can I sign up for flood warnings in my area?

Floodline Warnings Direct is a free service that sends you messages by telephone, mobile (voice messages and SMS text), fax, pager or email when flood warnings are issued in your area.

All you need to register is a telephone number where we can send flood warnings to you 24 hours a day.

To find out if flood warnings are available in your area, and to register your details for Floodline Warnings Direct, call Floodline now.

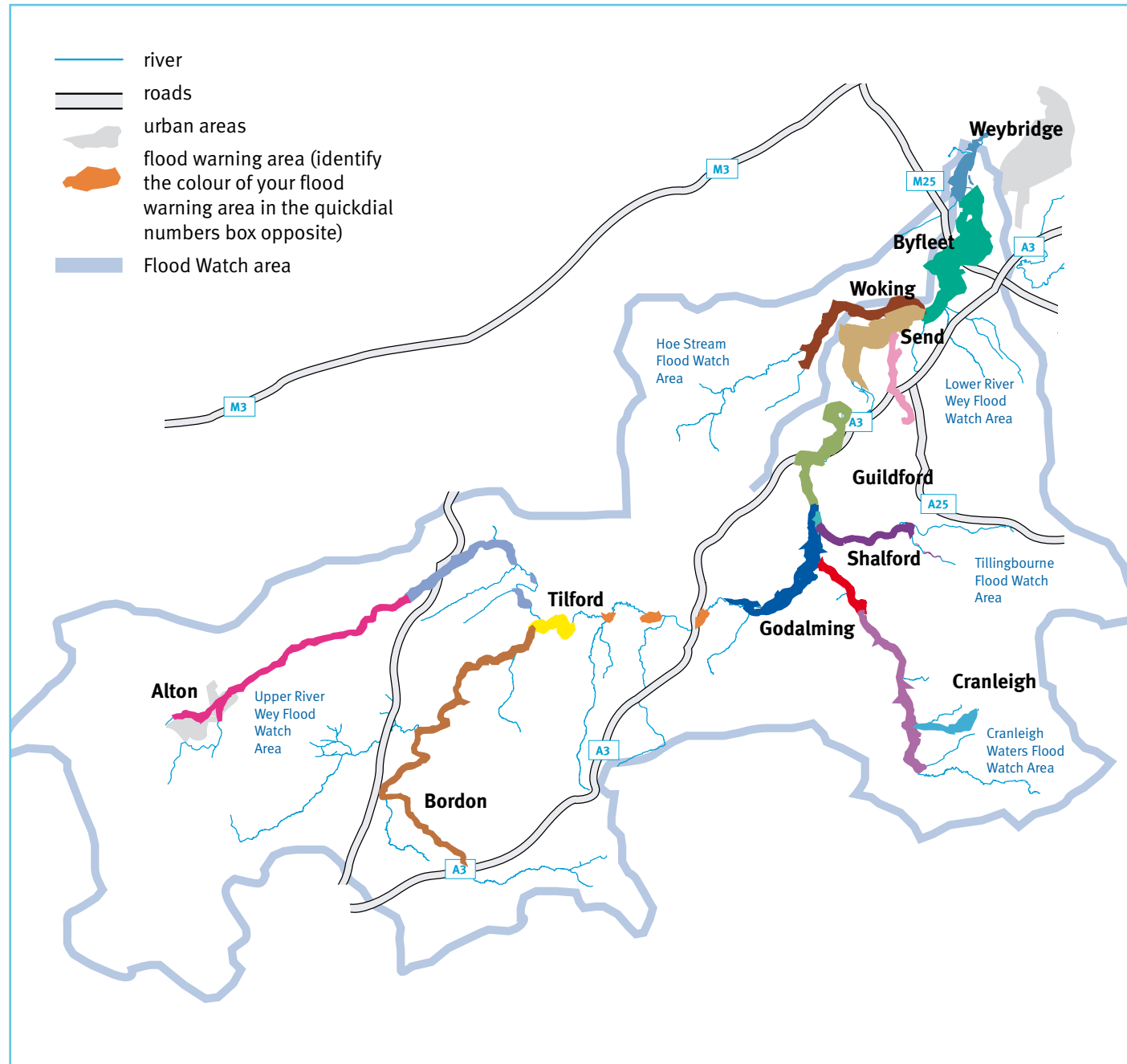

Note: the Watch quickdial number will provide Flood Watch information for the general area. This number is for people who are not in a Flood Warning Area. If you fall within a Flood Warning Area, use your Flood Warning Area quickdial number, which will provide both the warning and watch information.

what else can I do to prepare in advance?

- **Don't underestimate the damage a flood can do.** Contact your insurance company to check that your contents and buildings insurance covers flood damage.
- **Prepare a flood checklist.** Include a list of telephone numbers for family and friends.
- **Make up a flood kit.** Include a torch, blankets, waterproof clothing, wellingtons, battery-operated radio, bottled water, first-aid kit, medication and personal documentation.
- **Find out where to turn off your gas, water and electricity supplies.**
- **Store valuable, sentimental items and important documents upstairs or in a high place.**
