## CHANGES TO ROAR

The Big Lottery funding for ROAR has now come to an end. Consultation with 100 ROAR users showed families really valued the service and did not want it to end. The majority were happy to pay £2 per child to keep the sessions running and some were happy to pay more.

These results helped us make the decision to continue offering this service and charging a nominal fee of £2 per child, per session.

During October half term we will also be introducing a new Parent Helper Volunteer Scheme.

Each session we will enlist the support from up to 4 parent helper volunteers to take an active role during sessions. Parent helper volunteers will need to arrive at the start time, help set up equipment, interact with the children, help staff organise games and help pack away

equipment. Parent helpers' children may attend at a reduced rate of £1 per child.

# Runnymede Youth Council Update



Runnymede Youth Council (RYC) members have been working on a project set by the British Youth Council called The Youth Voice Award. The criteria included many categories, and the RYC had to record 10 hours

of activities relating to this criteria. The most interesting part for them was the consultation part. RYC came up with a questionnaire relating to sport,. The questionnaire asked questions that included age, school attended, sports currently participating in, sports that would like to participate in, availability to participate in sport each week and how much is reasonable to pay for sports courses. Each member

was set a target number for completed questionnaires. After looking at the results, RYC found out that the most popular sports young people would like to do, but don't currently are: lacrosse, dance mats, free running, Pilates, street dance and trampolining. The most popular times for courses were Weekends and the cost should be between £3 and £5 per session. The RYC will now look into the availability of these courses currently or the possibility of setting them up.

## 2011 P&G Surrey Youth Games Results

Runnymede won a gold medal in Boxing, and two bronze medals in junior girls' football and mixed tennis at this year's P&G Surrey Youth Games on Saturday 18 and Sunday 19 June, at the Surrey Sports Park, Guildford.

Runnymede had a total of 190 young people took part in the P&G Surrey Youth Games training sessions this year and

175 of those took part in the competition making up 16 teams in Basketball, Cricket, Football, Hockey, Netball, Swimming and Tag Rugby as well as individuals in boxing, judo, badminton, tennis and squash.

Shauna Giltinan who lives in Addlestone and has been a youth councillor at Runnymede Council for four years, won this

years Coach of the Games Award for her help and expertise coaching football and squash during this years training.



## Sportivate Funding

Sportivate is a nationwide campaign that forms part of the [Places, People, Play](#) Olympic legacy programme by the Government and Sport England.

Sportivate will target 14-25 yr olds. This target group will receive 6 weeks of high quality coaching in the sport of their choice and then be guided into regular participation within their local community.

In the last round of applications funding was awarded to Thames Valley Hockey Club to enable them to set up junior hockey sessions at Selesian school in Chertsey and Manorcroft United Junior Football Club received funding to deliver new coaching sessions at Strodes College in Egham

The next round of applications opens on 14 November and will close on 9 December 2011.

## National Lottery Olympic Park Run

The National Lottery will be hosting the first ever public event in the Olympic Stadium. The National Lottery Olympic Park Run will offer the chance for 5,000 participants to be the first to cross the Olympic finish line. It will take place on 31 March 2012 and the five mile course will be contained within the Olympic Park.

The ballot for this run opens on Friday 30<sup>th</sup> September and **closes at midnight on the 27<sup>th</sup> October 2011.**

This event has been organised as a celebration of the £2.2bn National Lottery players contribute towards the funding of the London 2012 Olympic and Paralympic Games, including the venues and infrastructure.

The online ballot can be entered by visiting [www.national-lottery.co.uk/run](http://www.national-lottery.co.uk/run) and the run is open to anyone aged 16 or over, of any running ability. The 5,000 lucky hopefuls chosen from the ballot will also be allocated a pair of spectator passes each to the Olympic Stadium, so that two friends or family members can cheer them on and be part of this memorable occasion.

The cost of entering The National Lottery Olympic Park Run will be £15 for successful applicants which covers a race number, two spectator passes for the Olympic Stadium, a full information pack, an event T-shirt to run in on the day, computer chip timing for a completely accurate running time, a souvenir finisher's medal, on-course refreshments and a finisher's pack.

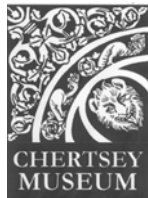
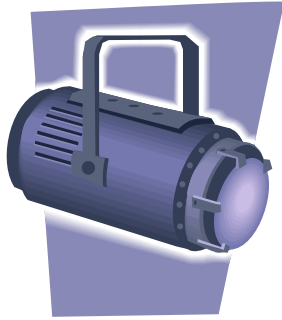
