#### Runnymede Infrastructure Delivery Schedule 2025-2030

- 1.1 The original Runnymede Infrastructure Delivery Schedules (IDS) set out the information contained in the Infrastructure Delivery Plan (IDP) and its Addendum in 5-year phases to cover the 2015-2030 Local Plan period. The purpose of the IDS is to identify the infrastructure required to support new development generated by the 2030 Local Plan.
- 1.2 The IDS was first published in July 2018. This document provides an update to the IDS, reflecting any changes to infrastructure delivery plans since 2018 and to take account of new project information submitted by infrastructure providers and other key stakeholders. The latest IDS now focuses on the final 5-year Local Plan phase of 2025-2030, presented by infrastructure category, and contains a table showing completed/removed projects from previous phases.
- 1.3 The IDS seeks to be comprehensive but in some cases, they may not yet contain all the desired information on project costs and timescales. The IDS may also contain some schemes that have not yet been confirmed in local authority/infrastructure provider spending programmes and budgets. The IDS reflects the 'living' document referred to in the IDP, and will continue to be updated periodically as new information becomes available, in accordance with the Council's Developer Contributions Governance Arrangements<sup>1</sup>.
- 1.4 The IDS contains many projects, and it is recognised that there is a limit to the extent of funding available the IDP explains in more detail the extent of the funding gap and recognises that projects will need to be subject to prioritisation. The IDS indicates the prioritisation category for each project which will assist with the allocation and expenditure of the Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL). This reflects the hierarchy of infrastructure set out in the Council's Infrastructure and Delivery Prioritisation Supplementary Planning Document (SPD). However, there will be other factors to consider in the prioritisation of projects when spending decisions are made (described in more detail in the Developer Contributions Governance Arrangements<sup>1</sup>).
- 1.5 Appendix A sets out how certain generic infrastructure costs set out in the IDP have been calculated in each 5-year phase. The IDS takes account of both borough wide and site level projects. Some of the cost assumptions used in the original IDP/IDS have been updated to provide a more accurate indication of the funding required to deliver projects, based on up-to-date feedback from infrastructure providers.
- 1.6 The Runnymede Strategic Highways Report (SHAR) 2019 identifies a number of hotspots on the local highway network. The identification of some of these hotspots does not necessarily mean that mitigation is required, but that Surrey County Council and Runnymede Borough Council need to ensure that these junctions which are within the catchment of forthcoming development sites are assessed in detail as part of Transport Assessments submitted with relevant planning applications. These hotspots continue to be included under the 'Highways' section of this updated IDS, with costs and delivery to be determined through individual planning application Transport Assessments.
