- Ethnicity: White: 89%, Asian/Asian British: 2%, Mixed / Multiple: 1%,






 Over half of respondents have not personally been a victim of crime.



What makes you 'very concerned' about crime in your local area? •











In the last 12 months, do you feel ASB levels across Runnymede have:




- Most respondents believe ASB levels in Runnymede have increased over the last 12 months.



 There is a lack of confidence that the CSP are dealing with ASB in Runnymede.





In the last 12 months, within the borough of Runnymede, have you been victim to a hate crime?








Did you report the hate crime or incident?
