## **Adoption Statement**

## Runnymede 2030 Local Plan

In accordance with the above regulations, notice is hereby given that Runnymede Borough Council formally adopted the Runnymede 2030 Local Plan ("the Plan") on **16**<sup>th</sup> **July 2020.** 

The Runnymede 2030 Local Plan sets out the key planning policies which determine the location, scale and timing of new development in the Borough in the period up to 2030, including the spatial development strategy, allocations for housing, employment and retail development and protection of the environment. The Local Plan also contains a suite of planning policies against which planning applications in the Borough will be determined.

The policies contained within the Plan supersede all of the saved policies of the Runnymede Local Plan 2001. Appendix D of the Plan lists the policies of the 2001 Local Plan that are replaced by policies in the 2030 Local Plan, and also which policies from the 2001 Local Plan have been deleted but not replaced.

Ms Mary Travers, the Inspector appointed by the Secretary of State to undertake the examination of the Submission Runnymede 2030 Local Plan issued her final report on 28 May 2020. The report was published by the Council on 1<sup>st</sup> June 2020. The report concludes that, with the recommended main modifications, the Plan satisfies the requirements of Section 20(5) of the Planning and Compulsory Purchase Act 2004 and meets the criteria for soundness in the National Planning Policy Framework.

The Plan incorporates all of the main modifications to the version of the Plan that was submitted by the Council to the Secretary of State in July 2018 (Submission Plan), as recommended by the Inspector in her final report. The Plan also incorporates Runnymede Borough Council's additional minor modifications to the Submission Plan.

Any person aggrieved by the adoption of the Plan may make an application to the High Court, under Section 113 of the Planning and Compulsory Purchase Act 2004, on the grounds that the document is not within the appropriate power of the local planning authority and/or a procedural requirement has not been complied with. Any such application must be made not later than 6 weeks after the date of adoption specified above.
