I am writing to ask if the CIL consultation period, can be extended. In my view this needs to happen, on the basis that a large number of people are now having to self isolate and as such will not be able to visit libraries and alike, where the CIL documents are available for inspection.

I am particularly concerned that people over 70 years of age, may not have Internet access to view documents on line and as such would be the group most likely to use the public locations to view the CIL documents.

In my view the CIL consultation period should be extended to a date when self isolation for the over 70's ends, this is in order to avoid key members of the community being excluded from making valuable comments.


Dear Sir/Madam,

The Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) is a mechanism by which Runnymede Borough Council can raise funds from development toward infrastructure in the Borough. The Council must set out what it proposes to charge development in a CIL Charging Schedule and charges can be based on the type, scale or location of development based on £ per sqm of new floorspace. CIL is a non-negotiable charge and will work in tandem with the current method of raising infrastructure funding from development through Section 106 agreements.

This email is to inform you that Runnymede Borough Council has prepared a draft CIL Charging Schedule which sets out a number of different charges based on the location of development within the Borough for residential, student and office developments. The

draft schedule is open to public consultation from Monday 24 February to Monday 6 April and details can be found in the attached letter and on the Council's web-site at: <https://www.runnymede.gov.uk/article/15518/Community-Infrastructure-Levy-CIL-> To support CIL Runnymede has also prepared a draft Infrastructure Delivery & Prioritisation Supplementary Planning Document (SPD). The SPD sets out how the Council will prioritise infrastructure funding and the approach to Section 106 once CIL has been implemented.
